Ramp in the words of the designer

What was the inspiration behind Ramp?

S– I asked myself what would be left if I take a table and peel its top off – like a can of sardines where you can see the open lid but also some of the inside. I wanted to see how this idea can be used for a chair or some other seat. My goal is always to create movement, lightness and the sense of play, to make the static furniture feel alive. I am satisfied, as Ramp has this organic, youthful quality. The name refers to skateboarding ramps, with their distinctive shape.

What are the key features of Ramp?

S– The prominent feature of Ramp is its frame. In a seat, it is usually the hidden part, whereas here it was made visible and became the main feature. I like the idea that you have the frame and then can decide what elements to put on it and where. Thus, the frame allows for freedom and uniqueness, it helps you make the seat your own.

Also, what sets Ramp apart is it organic shape. Modular furniture is usually square, and Ramp tends to be softer. The collection is characterized by curved shapes in order to look less technical and rigid compared to the vast majority of seating systems currently available on the market.

At the core of every Skrivo project lies a commitment to innovation. By believing in starting with the fundamentals, whether it's materials, function, or technology, to craft designs that are both stimulating and timeless.



What was your design process with this product? Was it in any way different than usually?

S– Ramp came from a dialog, not just sketching. I was talking with someone about how interesting it would be to peel the tabletop off, so this time initially there was no drawing, but rather some back and forth of questions. Of course, sketching came up later – I usually start with some sketches and then do the 3D to see if the idea is still useful and whether any changes are needed.

What drives you while designing furniture?

S– For me, designing is a challenge – there are already so many products, so with every new one I have to find new solutions. So much furniture is being made today!


I really like the initial stage, making small rough sketches on paper to pour my ideas. I am very visual and use drawing kind of like a stream of consciousness. Seeing the idea come true, being able to feel the real product, that's a great reward. When the product is made, I like to think about its lifecycle, how it will be used, how people with interact with it.

In case of Ramp, it was designed to be easily split into parts and materials – both in terms of changing the elements that are used or damaged and in terms of rearranging the layout. It will also help at its end of life, as materials can be easily recycled. I wanted Ramp to be flexible and changing.

How was working with .mdd for you?

S– The whole cooperation process was very transparent and it was easy to communicate, which is usually tricky, as I usually work with producers from a distance. It is even more common after Covid and everyone seems used to such way of working together. This time it was all very easy and pleasant! We both had a clear vision of the final product, and I really appreciate your more conceptual approach to the design, not so traditional. Visiting the factory, I reassured myself about the synergy that we had and understood it better. Obviously, I saw photos of the prototype earlier, but seeing the real one made me appreciate the work even more.

Bris in the words of the designer

What was the idea behind Bris?

A– The intended meaning of the Bris collection was "indoor to outdoor", so that would be a universal piece of seating. I wanted to create a chair, that can seamlessly move from the interior to the terrace, to create visual continuity between those spaces.

In terms of design, the most important idea was the movements of the chair's rods. I was of course tempted to work with parallel, symmetric lines, as that's an easier way to solve the design. But it is the uncomfortable work that makes this sort of interesting pieces, a chair that is different and beautiful.

As the family will feature a chair, an armchair and a high stool, all born from the same form. My aim was to use as many pieces that are the same as possible, to keep them all compatible and matching visually. What sets them apart is the back rod (that creates the armrests) and obviously the base, higher for the stool – the rest of the elements is the same.

My inspiration comes from design itself, from design culture and its history. It is there where I educate my sensitivity and at the same time, I find the themes to develop in my designs.

Are there any hidden features or solutions to Bris?

A– Bris seams random, but it is all carefully thought out, every design decision has an aim and a cause – and it all fits perfectly when you sit on it. The arrangement of bars was designed specifically for the body. The middle one is not perfectly centered to make space for the spine, and the density of the bars increased in areas where the user's weight accumulates. I wanted to make sure that the final product will be comfortable, as a chair has to be. The first thing you do when you sit on it, you touch the armrests and let your body feel it and tell you whether it's good. I believe, that with its meticulous bar placement, Bris will be intuitively comfortable.

What drives you while designing furniture? What is the most important part of the design work for you?

A– When designing a piece of furniture, it is as important to work on the intangible aspects of the design (linked to emotions) as tangible ones (related to the technology and materials with which we solve the design).

The challenge, and the beauty of designer's work, is to find that detail, proportion or gesture that makes the design proposal unique, attractive and special. But we must achieve this by respecting our cultural heritage, which is responsible for our collective imaginary. So you need to know the possible limits where we can be purposeful and innovative, but at the same time accepted by the market.

A– I also consider comfort to be unquestionable: we design products whose focus should be on offering the best user experience, and comfort should not be conditioned by aesthetics, cost or new styles.

Besides, I strongly believe that designer has to understand the technology, otherwise they are unable to design anything for the industry. For me that's the core of the process, to adapt to the technological limitations and to use them as creative boost. It is important to speak with the team that makes the prototypes and later the final product as they know the technology, material etc. best. And me, a designer, I learn a lot in the process, trying to adapt the design and working hands on.

On a more abstract level, I seek for emotions in colours. It is nice to have some texture, to feel the paint and let the design speak to your senses. With Bris, there is also the shadow play of the bars, as it shows the chair in a soft and sensual way. Apart from how various colours works with the shape of each furniture, it also has to act in the space. Sometimes a vibrant accent is needed, and sometimes it is all natural and should stay like that. My job is to take both those cases into considerations.

What is your design process? Was there anything different with this product?

A– For me, the first impression and the initial idea are very valuable. I start with sketching and a basic 3D drawing to check the proportions (the key to well-designed furniture!), then comes a lot of research and modifications, but I usually find out that I come back to the early design and tend to choose it.

I like the research phase, and thus research a lot of information, basically everything that I can. A lot of research is included in the design work – even more than designing itself. That is because to be able to design something different, I have to know a lot about the market. I study the typology to see what is missing from it. With Bris, that's where the idea appeared to create movement with the wires and to not place them parallel. It is easier to do them parallel, but I find it boring. Also, having this illusion of movement is the trick to creating something different. Of course, you can just use proportions to fit into the typology, but you have to be courageous to design something new.

Another essential part of my design process is to make prototypes – not paper ones, but rather in the final materials. Prototypes contain the beauty of the ephemeral and unfinished but at the same time, it gives us the certainty to make the best decisions.

A— I work with materials such as aluminium, plastic, metal, cardboard and use 3D printing. For Bris, the prototype was made in bent aluminium and carved foam. After the mock-up is done, I leave it alone in my studio and come back to it the next day to have a look from various perspectives, to sit on it. I often ask my friends to test it. I do that for a few days and it is a fight with myself, as I have to choose just one of the ideas and leave the rest behind. Design is a journey and I do not want to lose any part of it, but I have to adjust to the client and user feedback.


As the essential feature of each chair is its comfort of use, I use the prototypes to check the ergonomics of each design – I have even built a machine to test them in my studio along with the sitting tests. I have confidence in the ergonomics of my designs, and if there's something uncomfortable and bad, I take the responsibility.




Coda Acoustic Booth
